Tom also was desk officer for the political and economic relations with Vietnam and the Philippines, and was a member of the economic diplomacy team preparing the Economic Missions led by the then-Prince Philippe of Belgium. In 2012, he was elected as the chairman of the youth wing of the Flemish Christian-Democratic Party CD&V, to end his mandate prematurely in November 2014 and become a Member of the European Parliament.
